What is the PE & Sport Premium?

The PE and Sport Premium is a grant designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. In most cases, the amount of funding is determined by the number of pupils in the school using data from the January school census. Schools with 17 or more pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil.

Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that schools should use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that our school already offers
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years, with a focus on building 'physical literacy' teaching.
- Close the gender and disability gap within sports
- Ensure that all children in KS1&2 are receiving 2 hours of PE – with a holistic focus
- Enhance a 'whole school approach' to being active everyday

Reflections on the last academic year:

Last academic year (2023-2024) we used our £17,900 funding as follows:

- To enable our children to attend competitive sporting fixtures
- To provide sport and physical activity clubs led by coaches; e.g. lunchtime archery and basketball clubs
- To provide sport and physical activity workshops for all children; e.g. Dan the Skipping Man
- To update existing equipment including specialised skipping ropes and PhysiFUN resources
- To enable our pupils to have swimming lessons

How much Sport Premium has the school received?

Funding received for the academic year 2024/25 - **£17,800**

Key improvements made possible through the sport funding to date:

- Employment of PE specialist company to teach KS1 and KS2 on a part-time basis
- Continuous update of sports and playground equipment to benefit all children
- CPD for all staff in Get Set 4 P.E.
- Ongoing CPD for specialist teacher and networking events
- Year 3-Year 6 swimming lessons
- Catch up swimming lessons due to Covid
- Sporting after school clubs
- Funding for children to attend fixtures and competitions
- Sustainable impact on school competition
- Membership of Active Surrey

Swimming:

At Cranleigh C of E, all children in Year 3 attend Swimming lessons at Cranleigh Leisure Centre from January. We aim to ensure that all children in Year 6 leave school competent and most importantly safe, in the water. Providing swimming lessons in Year 3 gives us the opportunity to identify those children who are on target to reach the desired level. The sport funding ensures that we can fund the swimming lessons. Those that are not on target are signposted to intensive lessons during holiday times and provided with catch-up lessons in the summer term of Year 6.

The following information provides performance measure outcomes for swimming in Year 6 in Summer Term 2024:

Meeting national requirements for swimming and water safety	% of Year 6 pupils
