

## All Saints' Day - 1st November Fun Facts!




- Some symbols that are used to represent All Saints' Day include a sheaf of wheat, the hand of God, the crown, and the symbols of individual saints.
- All Saints' Day is also known as:All Hallows' Day, the Feast of All Saints, Solemnity of All Saints, and Hallowmas.
- When is All Saints' Day in Mexico? In Mexico, All Saints' Day coincides with the first day of the Day of the Dead (Dia de los Muertos) celebration.
- 4. In Portugal, children go door to door wishing people a happy All Saints' Day and asking for sweet treats.
- 5. A reading of the Beatitudes is a traditional part of Mass on All Saints' Day.

To all those within our community celebrating **Diwali** on 31st October/1st November, we hope you have a very special time.







All children who attended school today were treated to a school disco! They had a wonderful time - as did our staff!! We also provided a low-volume disco for those children who find loud noises challenging.





