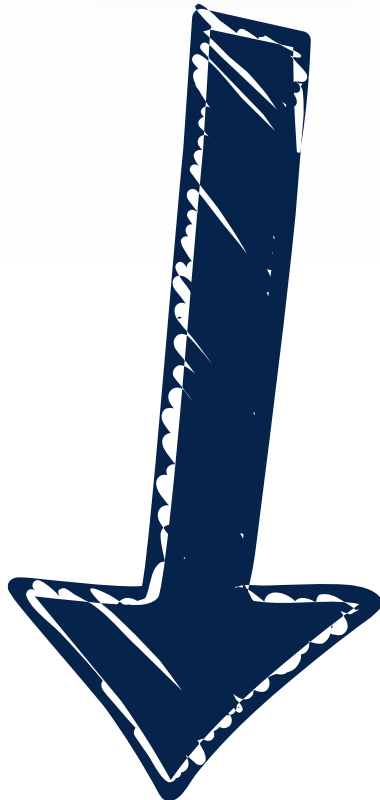




Dear God,

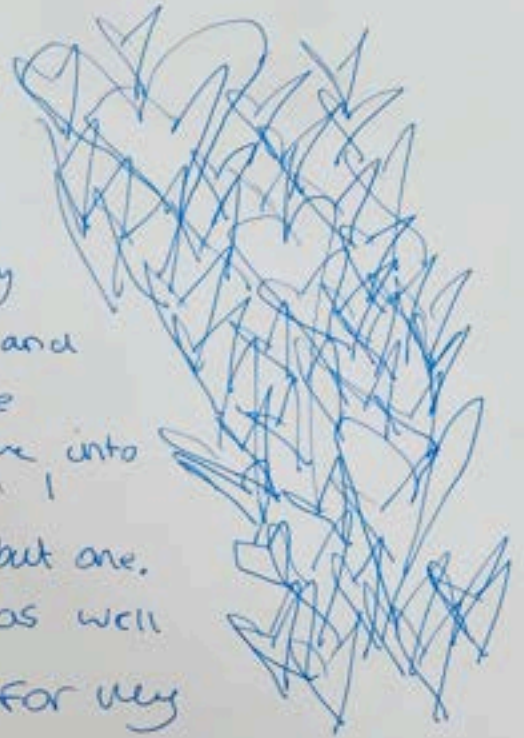

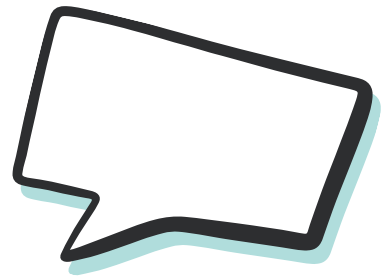
