School Progress Update

I am delighted to share the results of our recent mock Ofsted inspection, which took place on Tuesday. The inspection highlighted the significant progress we have made as a school, and if this had been a real Ofsted inspection, we would no longer be in special measures. In fact, many areas of our school are now considered 'good'.

Key highlights:

Behaviour & Attitudes - Rated 'Good'

Pupils' behaviour around the school continues to be strong. They behave well, with clear routines ensuring smooth transitions. During lessons, almost all pupils are attentive and focus well. Staff foster warm, positive relationships, and pupils show kindness and patience towards their peers.


Personal Development – Rated 'Good'

Pupils actively engage in leadership roles, such as the school council and Year 5 sports crew. Diversity is celebrated, with different languages and faiths recognised across the school. Pupils show empathy and respect, particularly towards those with SEND.

What this means for our school:

This report is a testament to the hard work of our staff, pupils, and the entire school community. We are incredibly proud of the rapid improvements made and remain committed to further progress. While there are still areas to develop, we are now a 'good' school in many areas, albeit not officially, and that is something to celebrate.

Faith

Easter is the most important celebration in the Christian calendar, marking Jesus' death and resurrection. On Good Friday, Jesus was crucified, sacrificing Himself for the world. His friends were heartbroken, but on Easter Sunday, they discovered that the tomb was empty; Jesus had risen! His resurrection brings a message of hope, new life, and God's everlasting love.

Matthew 28:5-6:

"The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said."

As we celebrate Easter, we remember this message of hope and renewal, encouraging us to show kindness, love, and faith in our daily lives.

Yesterday, Year 2 recreated the Easter resurrection story using natural materials.

They worked creatively to bring the story to life, gathering items like leaves, twigs, and flowers to represent key moments from the narrative. This hands-on activity helped deepen their understanding of the story. Thank you to Local Committee member Mike Tomlinson of Cranleigh's Baptist Church for coming in to help!











Here are some fun and meaningful Easter activities for you and your family to enjoy at home:

Easter Story Time

Read the Easter story together from a children's Bible or watch an animated version online. Discuss its meaning and how it teaches love, hope, and kindness.

Easter Garden

Create a small Easter garden using soil, flowers, stones, and a small cross. This represents Jesus' tomb and the resurrection, making the Easter story visual and interactive.

Resurrection Rolls

Bake simple "resurrection rolls" using marshmallows wrapped in dough. As they bake, the marshmallow melts, leaving an empty space inside symbolising Jesus' empty tomb.

Easter Egg Hunt with a Twist

Instead of just chocolate eggs, hide small notes with Bible verses or acts of kindness written on them for your child to find.

Make Easter Cards

Encourage your child to create Easter cards with messages of hope and joy to share with family, friends, or neighbours.

Act of Kindness Challenge

Easter is about love and generosity. Set a challenge to do small acts of kindness, such as helping a sibling, making a thank-you card, or donating to a charity.


